


for 6mmFlyRC's F/A-18 Super Hornet

The US Navy's Blue Angels was the world's first official military flight demonstration team. Formed in 1946, the Blue Angels have a long and proud history. They have utilised a wide variety of aircraft through the years, including Grumman F6F Hellcats, McDonnell Douglas F-4 Phantom IIs, McDonnell Douglas A-4F Skyhawks, and currently McDonnell Douglas (now Boeing) F/A-18 Hornets.

The Blue Angels employ A/B model Hornets, however this decal set depicts a fictionalised E/F Super Hornet scheme.








Below is the 2006 season Blue Angels pilot roster. Use to match the cockpit sill text with appropriate tail numbers and aircraft BuNo's.

It should be noted that Blue Angel 7 is a 2 seater (i.e. an F/A-18D) and is not normally flown as part of routine displays. There are actually 3 separate D model aircraft allocated to the squadron that can be used as BA7, none of which are assigned a dedicated pilot. As such, I have not included BuNo's for these aircraft.


